




The National Film School in $\pm \acute{o}d\acute{z}$ is one of the oldest film schools in Europe. Founded in 1948 in $\pm \acute{o}d\acute{z}$ — the only big city near Warsaw that has not been destroyed during the II WW and thus preserved a unique architectural heritage, mainly from the XIX century.

The Łódź Film School has become internationally renowned and remains the most famous film school in Poland, educating future actors, directors, cinematographers, producers and TV staff.

This year, the Shool is celebrating it's 65th anniversary.





Among Shool's graduates are three Oscarwinning alumni: Roman Polanski, Andrzej Wajda and Zbigniew Rybczynski, as well as other internationally acclaimed filmmakers and cinematographers: Krzysztof Kieslowski, Jerzy Skolimowski, Krzysztof Zanussi, Slawomir Idziak, Pawel Edelman, to name only a few.

On the occasion of the 65th anniversary of the Łódź Film School, a special retrospective screening will be dedicated to the best short films directed by the School's most prominent graduates (including Roman Polanski, Krzysztof Kieslowski and Andrzej Wajda), as well as to the more recent, award winning student films, in the second part of the programme.
